Grants and Housing

2022 was an exciting year for the Grant and Housing Committee! In addition to the new online application, the committee initiated site visits with our grant recipients. This enabled committee members to become more familiar with the recipients, the projects IOC funded and to pass this information on to the board. Net proceeds from Joining Hands Benefit Shop were used for housing grants issued by IOC to support emergency shelter, re-entry, temporary, transitional, and permanent supportive housing for women, families, men, and seniors, supporting homelessness prevention in Monterey County. IOC granted \$127,000 in 2022 to local agencies providing housing solutions to those in need. Since 2010, IOC has awarded \$690,555 in grants.



Our Executive Director, MaryAnn Spadoni accepted the award on behalf of IOC with a table of volunteers cheering her on.








Gratitude Celebration
